PERSONAL WAR SKETCH  
OF

Comrade Daniel S. Spragg

Who was born the Twenty ninth day of October A.D. 18 33 in  
New Brunswick County of \_\_\_\_\_ State of \_\_\_\_\_

I first entered the service of the United States, Aug 13 1862 and was mustered in Oct 3, 1862 as a private in Co. "C" 27<sup>th</sup> Reg. Iowa Vol. Infantry, at Independence, Iowa. I was promoted to the rank of Fourth Corporal on June 15, 1864, and was Fourth Corporal and Flag Guard when discharged on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of July, 1865, at Montgomery, Alabama, the war being finished. My first battle was at Little Rock, Ark, Sept. 10, 1863 and other engagements were:- Marion, Miss Feb 17, 1864, Blain's Landing Apr. 11, 1864, Ditch Bayou, Ark June 6, 1864, Tupelo, Miss. July 14, 1864. Old Town Creek July 15 1864, Nashville Tenn. Dec. 15 & 16, 1864, and Ft. Blakely, Ala. Apr. 9, 1865. I was never wounded. I was confined in the Hospital at Little Rock, Ark, In October, 1863, and at Memphis, Tenn. Some of my most intimate comrades in the service were James A Poor, H.C. Hemenway, Lewis A. Main, Geo Whait, Geo. and Ed Spalding, A. Littlejohn, and Byron Hale.
