OF

Comrade Walter L. Clemons

Who was born the 5th day of August A.D. 1829 in  
St. Albans County of Licking State of Ohio and  
entered the service March 4, 1864 at Madison Wis. as a private in Co. "A" 36<sup>th</sup> Wis. Inf.

Was promoted to the rank of 2<sup>nd</sup> Sergeant and was discharged with that rank June 1, 1865, at Washington D.C. at the close of the war.

My first battle was at the Spotsylvania Court House Va., and other engagements were Bowling Green, Turners Farm, Cold Harbor, Hatchers Run, Appomattox.

Was wounded June 2, 1864 at Turner's Farm, Va. and went to hospital.

My intimate comrades were James Canon, Frank Buoh, J.F. Lunn, Barney Hatton, August Ripley.

I consider the most important event of my service the surrender of Lee, at Appomattox.
