Comrade Leslie Greenwood

Who was born the 5th day of December A.D. 1846 in  
Marlborough County of \_\_\_\_\_ State of New Hampshire

He was but 16 yrs. old when he first began his work with General Thomas at Chattanooga and was only 4ft 11 3/4 in tall and weighed but 91 lbs and they would not accept him as a soldier but he could write a little and so he was used in that way. As soon as he could enlist he did so. Gen Thomas told him that the time would come when it would be a special source of pride to be able to say he had been a Union soldier. When he did enlist it made no difference in his work but it reduced his pay from \$100 per mo. to a privates pay.

He first enlisted Feb. 4th, 1865 at Galesburg, Knox Co. Ill. as private in Co. F. 148th Ill. Vol. Inf. He was discharged Nov. 7th, 1865 at Knoxville, Tennessee.

He had served as citizen clerk in 1863-64 with army as Special Order Clerk in the Nareous Commands with which he served throughout Kentucky, Tenn. Alabama and Georgia. He was at Thomas Hdqters during the Atlanta Campaign ending at Franklin and Nashville.
